### From Deacon Don's desk:

In our Small Church Community we will have reflected on this Sunday's readings. The "Scripture Focus" is as follows: The Gospel today speaks of true wisdom, a priceless treasure to be sought with all one's heart. In the first comparison Jesus uses, a

man discovers a treasure that was so valuable that he "sold all he had and bought the field." In the second comparison a pearl merchant discovers a pearl worth more than all his other possessions. Common to both stories is the marvel of discovering such a prize and giving everything to gain possession of it. The point of both parables is that gaining the treasure of God's saving love is worth any sacrifice. Our challenge is to consider a time when a decision we made seems to be right or wrong or unwise. What made the difference in the decision?

Another question: What in your life now is most valuable to you? How do you find God present in that value?

Patience with God is FAITH. Patience with self is HOPE. Patience with others is LOVE.

Back to what I started and did not finish some months ago re: DIVINEOFFICE.org The LITURGY of the HOURS is basically based on the Psalms. Jesus Himself prayed the Psalms. Saint John Paul II said, "Through this prayer of Christ our day is sanctified, our activities transformed, our actions made holy. We pray the same psalms Jesus prayed and we become even more increasingly one with all the members of His body." It is no longer for the ordained priests, deacons, monks and religious but for ALL of us. OUR PRAYER: Heavenly Father, teach us how to discern Your will, how to follow it, and how to make it our own in all things, for in this lies true happiness in this world and in the next. Amen
