

## From the Pastor's desk:

While the disciples are in a boat during a storm, Jesus comes to them walking on the water. Peter expresses his desire to walk out on the water to meet Jesus. Peter is not being driven so much by curiosity, but by fear. In a

sense, Peter is begging Jesus to show him how it's done. But the story doesn't end there. Peter can't quite do it like Jesus is able to, so he begins to sink, crying out to Jesus, "Lord, save me!" The experience was nothing like Peter had imagined it would be.

I'm not sure exactly what Peter thought would happen. Did he think that walking on the water would be easy? Did he imagine that as soon as he stepped off the boat the storms would cease? Did Jesus make it look too easy?

So what exactly does it take? Well, the Gospel today can help us answer that question. It appears that the storm had Peter's attention more than Jesus did. The "stuff' going on around him distracted him, worried him, got the best of him. Jesus may have still been in Peter's line of vision, but Peter's focus was elsewhere. There was just too much else going on. When Jesus has our full attention, He will be clearly visible in every person, in every situation.

Peter's instinct to step out into the unknown to encounter Jesus was a good one. He went against his instincts to leave a safe place, the boat, for one that from the outside seemed less safe, the water. That alone shows a lot of trust. May each of us never lose that courage when it comes to following the Lord.

## From Deacon Don's desk:

A columnist once asked Cecil B. DeMille, director of *The Ten Commandments*, "What commandment do you think people break most today?" His response, "The first Commandment: You shall not have other gods besides Me." (Exodus 20:2). Then

he added, "Oh, we don't bow down before graven images, but we do worship gods of comfort, gods of money and gods of power."

"The average times that people say "NO" to temptation is about once, **weakly**..... Anon.

As I write this, it happens to be the feast day of St. John Vianney, patron saint of priests. He wrote, "I have said that temptation is necessary for us, to preserve us in humility and distrust of self and oblige us to take refuge with God. Once a superior said to a hermit who was violently tempted by the devil, "My friend, do you wish me to ask God to deliver you from these temptations?" "No Father," answered the hermit, "for they have the effect of keeping me continually in the presence of God, because it constantly necessitates my taking refuge with God, that He may stand by me in my struggles." Meanwhile, my brethren, we can say that it is one of the surest signs we are on the path to heaven, if we are tempted, no matter how humiliating the temptation may be. We are certain that God will not give way to the devil, and that He will prepare for us the crown of glory which I wish you all.

Pray for our priests, especially our pastor and the newly ordained and for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Did You Know? Summertime, safe time - All teachers, staff and volunteers in the Archdiocese must undergo fingerprinting and criminal background checks. Archdiocesan guidelines and abuse prevention training programs currently in use in the Archdiocese emphasize the importance of parents knowing who has access to their children at school and other church-sponsored activities. Parents should remain vigilant regarding who is granted access to their children. Make sure camp counselors have undergone criminal background checks. Make sure you know the camp's "daily routine." In particular, make sure that no camp activity results in a child being left alone with one adult. All activities should be supervised by more than one adult, and the camp should be open to unannounced drop-in visits from parents. For more information email: Dn.
