

From the Pastor's desk:

It can be very easy, for an organization as big as the Church to be distracted from the fundamental truth that we are dependent upon God. Sometimes we can convince ourselves that it's our skills, or our ideas and our work that really

matter. The encounter that Peter has with Jesus In today's gospel should cause us to step back and reflect on that.

Do we see ourselves as large foundation stones that do not depend on anyone else? Or do we see ourselves as little pebbles that God wants to use for His own purposes rather than our own?

The Second Vatican Council said that we should look at the Church in a different way from some of the images used in the past. From the many images the Council uses, there is one primary image that has evolved. The Church is seen as the Pilgrim People of God. This image doesn't exude power, or strength or dominance. In fact, it seems to be the opposite of these notions.

As a Pilgrim People, God leads us to the heavenly kingdom, and we can make this journey only if we depend upon the strength of God. Even today we are still a pilgrim people seeking our way to the kingdom of God through the hopes and joys, the sorrows and the pains that we encounter in our modern world. My prayer for each of us is that we come to know more fully that this is the Church of which we are members.

What woman in history has inspired more art, poetry, or more music than any other woman? What woman has appeared more times on the cover of TIME magazine than any other woman? Yep, you guessed it! It's **Mary**, the mother of God! And

we claim her as our own mother. This past two weeks we have celebrated the feast of the **Assumption of Mary** and last Friday, the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Lest we forget: her birthday Sept 8 and then Sept. 15 Our Lady of Sorrows.

Matthew Kelly in "Rediscovering Catholicism" notes that the first Christians gathered around her for comfort and guidance. We, on the other hand, seem to avoid her. He continues "...we need to find a place for her in our spirituality....not on our dashboard! Rosaries are hung on rear view mirrors and our necks but I have yet to see one in the hand of a driver! Put your cell phone down and pick up the rosary!"

At Pablo Casals 95th birthday, a reporter asked, "Mr. Casals, you are 95 and acclaimed as the greatest cello player that every lived. Why do you still practice six hours every day? Pablo Casals said, "because I think I'm making progress!" That's persistence! While on the subject of persistence: Tina and I have been members of St. Joseph parish since 1970 and have been here during Fr. Martin, founding pastor's reign. Have seen pastors, many dedicated associates, and many others, **but** none have surpassed **Fr. Ford** in persistence!
