

### From the Pastor's desk:

When Jesus begins to talk about the personal suffering and the dreadful ordeal that was ahead of him, his friend, Peter, won't have any of it. The very thought of Jesus being persecuted or assaulted in any way is enough to make

Peter rebel against the prospect.

It would have been a great temptation for Jesus to sneak away, to make plans to avoid the upcoming scenario. How easy, how tempting that might have been. But Jesus had to make a decision. He made a decision to love. And He decided to go forward.

Peter's way of thinking is the natural and human way of reacting to evil and suffering. We would probably all say what Peter said. But there is another way of thinking, the way that God thinks about things, and God's ways are quite different than ours.

So what is the message that we can learn from this Gospel reading today? Maybe it is that in our lives in this world, we naturally seek to save ourselves, to look after ourselves, and even to live a prosperous life. Jesus tells us however, that sometimes this can be a narrow, limited and short-sighted way of living.

Jesus will show us, in his own life, and in his own way of facing life and death issues, that there is another and a better way of living. And that way is to live a life of love, to live for one another, and not for ourselves. Jesus died so that we might live, no longer for ourselves but for him, and for love of one another.

Because of his love for us, Jesus went willingly to the cross. He accepted the suffering that his enemies inflicted on him. As his followers, we're invited to do the same.

### From Deacon Don's desk: Rev. Fr. Rolheiser, OMI, thous



Rev. Fr. Rolheiser, OMI, though in exile, continues to enlighten through the Tidings. Last week he highlighted Pope Francis' "Ten Secrets to Happiness." Taken from the Argentine weekly, July 29. #1 Live and Let Live: We will live longer and

more happily if we stop trying to arrange other peoples' lives. Jesus challenged us to not judge but to live with the tension, and let God and history make judgments. Live by our convictions and let others do the same.

#2 **Be Giving of Self to Others**: Happiness lies in giving ourselves away. We need to be open and generous, but if we withdraw into ourselves we run the risk of becoming selfcentered. No happiness is found there, since "stagnant water becomes putrid!"

#3. **Proceed Calmly**: Move with kindness, humility and calm. These are the antithesis of anxiety and distress. Calm never causes high blood pressure. We need to make conscious efforts to never let the moment cause panic and excess hurry. Rather be late than stressed.

#4. A Healthy Sense of Leisure: Never lose the pleasures of art, literature and playing with children. Remember that Jesus scandalized others with His capacity to enjoy life in all its sensuousness.

#5 Sundays Should Be Holidays. Workers Should Have Sundays off Because Sunday Is For Family: That is why God gave us a commandment to keep the Sabbath holy. This is not a lifestyle suggestion, but a commandment as binding as not killing.

OUR PRAYER: Father, may everything we do begin with Your inspiration and continue with Your saving help. Let our work always find its origin in You and through You reach completion. We ask this through Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit one God, for ever and ever. Amen.


