From Deacon Don's desk:

The season of Advent begins the new liturgical year. Advent focuses on the two "comings" of Christ, His birth and His return (second coming). In **last** year's Reading #1 Isaiah (2:1-5) pleads with the people to "walk in the light of the Lord."

He offers **hope** to God's people to wark in the light of the Lord. He offers **hope** to God's people in view of the threat of the Assyrians, hope that God has a plan for His people. This year's first reading (Isaiah 63: 61-17 and 64:2-7) ends with a beautiful metaphor that describes the Lord's relationship with His people Israel: "We are the clay, and You are our **potter**; we are all the work of Your hands." We must wait for the Lord. In our waiting moments we should take up the words of Blessed Teresa of Calcutta and continue to do the "corporal works of mercy," feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit the sick and imprisoned, give drink to the thirsty; this is what she calls the "**five-fingered Gospel**." To better understand it she raises her hand and says words you will hear from Jesus: "**You did it to Me,**" five words that give us the meaning of the Gospel verse MT 25:35.

OUR PRAYER: God of mercy, teach us to live in and with Your Liturgical Year. Help us to be filled with sentiments of joy proper to Advent and to prepare fittingly for the renewed birth of Your Son in our hearts. Amen
