

From the Pastor's desk:

Today's gospel about the temptation of Jesus tries to share with us how to avoid tragedy in our lives and helps us to understand clearly how Jesus' temptation in the desert has meaning for us today in our lives.

If we understand this, then we will be able to appreciate that the temptation of Jesus wasn't something strange and extraordinary that only had to do with Jesus and therefore has no real meaning for us.

In overcoming his temptations Jesus chose to accomplish his mission with complete faith and trust in God, living in and among all the uncertainties and limitations of the ordinary human condition in this world.

The gospel story is telling us that, like Jesus, we also have to overcome temptation and realize that the only way of salvation that God gives us, is to live and work within our human condition and with all of its limitations.

During Lent:

Give up worry - trust Divine Providence. Give up discouragement - be full of hope.

From Deacon Don's desk:

We are now beginning our Lenten Journey. Usually this Sunday we hear of the temptation of the Lord by the devil. Mark presents a shorter version: Jesus is driven into the desert by the Spirit. He is tempted by the devil.

Before going on I must give you something that relates to Jesus' "Agony in the Garden." Sometime during Lent I ask you to take few minutes, go to the Tabernacle and look up at the picture of Jesus kneeling at the rock. Thanks to Father Jim he placed this painting in its proper place. There's a story behind this painting. A parishioner; Frank Aimone (1920-1985) (pronounced "Eye mo knee"), an artist, wanted to do something special for St Joseph Church. With wood backing, thick plaster, many hours and days of carving out the relief and then painting, all told, over 500 hours of love!

But most important is the Love that is reflected in the painting. Jesus asks: "Father, if it possible, let this cup pass from Me; yet not as I will but as You will." Mt 26: 39.

Fr. Leonard, SJ says, "Believing in evil does not mean we have a convenient excuse for all the world's ills. As Jean Paul Sartre said, "Evil triumphs when good people do nothing." To keep choosing life and a love that drives out fear, we have to see evil, name it, and do something about it." OUR PRAYER: Father God, You conquer the darkness of ignorance by the light of Your Word. Strengthen in our hearts the faith You have given us; let not temptation ever quench the fire Your love has kindled within us. Amen

These are some signs an online predator may be connecting with your child: Your child becomes withdrawn and isolated from family and friends; you find inappropriate material on the computer; your child receives mail, money, or gifts from unknown people; you see unknown phone numbers when reviewing the phone bill. 
