From the Pastor's desk:

In John's Gospel, the Messiah's reign begins publicly, with this powerful symbolic act of driving out the moneychangers, and it begins right in the heart of God's house.

On a personal level, we can allow Jesus to overturn and throw out the moneychangers and animalsellers in our own lives. That means that whatever defiles the dwelling-place of God that is within each of us needs to be rooted out and destroyed.

John places this scene at the beginning of Christ's ministry, but the other Gospels feature it later. John wants to show us that this claim of Jesus of ushering in the messianic age, also connected with the reference to his resurrection, is the key to understanding the whole of the rest of the Gospel.

Jesus' resurrection is proof that His spirit is alive and well, living in people who profess their faith in Him. And that allows each one of us to be signs of hope to those who come into our lives.

In John's Gospel one of the first things Jesus does as He begins His work is to drive the moneychangers out of the temple. His life and His work that follows are summed up in the statement, "Zeal for My Father's house consumes me." Everything

Jesus does is based on the loving relationship He has with His Father. Here His actions express His desire to purify the relationship of the children of Israel with the God who called them into covenant. Throughout John's Gospel, Jesus will invite others into the relationship He shares with the Father. And through it all God proves His loyalty to us and gives us His only Son to prove His great love for us. Remember last week's Gospel when God says: "This is my beloved Son listen to Him." Only two times do we hear God's voice. The first is when Jesus is in the Jordan river and is baptized by his cousin John.

OUR PRAYER: Lord help us in this Lenten journey to listen more frequently to Your Word so we can celebrate this Easter solemnity with greater love for Christ. By Your Holy Spirit teach and encourage us, especially those in doubt and error to follow what is true and good. Amen


