

Quiz: Does the phrase "The Ten Commandments" appear in the bible? It is **not** found in the Bible. In Exodus, Chapter 20 begins, "Then God delivered **all** these commandments... I, the Lord, am your God, who brought you out of the land of

Egypt..." American Bible footnotes, "The precise division of Chapter 20, 1-17 precepts into the "ten commandments is somewhat uncertain. Among Catholics verses 1-6 are considered one commandment. Verse 17 is 2 commandments.

Each of the three readings for today relate to the human condition, our weakness and condition of sin and God's unlimited mercy. The journey through Lent challenges us to balance these realities as we look for reconciliation with God through His Son, Jesus Christ.

"May Christ shield me today....Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me. Christ in the mouth of everyone who speaks of me, Christ in every eye that sees me, Christ in every ear that hears me...." St Patrick.




