From the Pastor's desk:

Like the grain of wheat, Jesus has to let go of everything, including his own life, in order to bring life to others. Jesus bringing life is the primary focus of John's entire gospel. In the beginning was the word and the word

was with God and the word was God. Through him all things came into being, nothing came into being except through him. What has come into being with him is life.

Again in John, we hear that God so loved the world that he gave his only son. So that everyone who believes in him shall not perish but will have eternal life.

In the process, both Jesus and we will be transformed, just as the grain of wheat, apparently annihilated, becomes something altogether greater and enriching for others.

May we learn to see Jesus, not in a superficial way as the Greeks we hear about in today's Gospel, but that we see Him in a penetrating way that allows us to know Jesus deeply from within the depths of our own being.

Remember that the Jesus who let go of everything out of love for us invites us to discover that the life and the happiness that we all long for is in that letting go and letting God.

What is Lent?

For many, we think of Lent as a time of penance i.e. giving up something. **But** there is more:

Today in most Catholic parishes, adults are visibly making ready to receive the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. Lent then has regained that "baptismal" emphasis. We still can observe Lent through fasting, prayer and almsgiving, **but** we do it with the purpose of recalling our Baptism, our deepening of our commitment to Christ, **and** we do it in solidarity with those preparing to be baptized or received into the Church. Readings for each Sunday in Lent are chosen by the Church to relate to the journey of faith each of us undertakes to our basic baptismal call to be part of Christ.

Now is the time for us to include in our prayers those who are taking this journey that culminates at the Easter Vigil Mass. --Taken from Father Greg Friedman OFM's Sunday Soundbites
