

From Deacon Don's desk:

Last Sunday was about the "Good Shepherd." Besides shepherds tending the flock, they had to watch and protect them. At the end of the day he would inspect them for injuries and apply oil to cuts and wounds. The sheep knew their shepherd's

voice. On hearing that voice, they would follow their own shepherd. Jesus had another reason for calling Himself the "Good Shepherd." It's in Hebrew Scripture that refers to the Messiah as Shepherd 22 times making connection to the people of the era. If Jesus appeared in our modern world, to whom do you think He would liken Himself as a compassionate person? Superman? Batman? I would suppose the closest He would come to an example is that of a mother, a compassionate mom who holds her child close to her heart and dresses the cuts and bruises and kisses the injured knee or hand. They are the "shepherds" of our day.

In Oct. 1986, the Irish Express paper's front page read, "Coach David Hay of the Glasgow Celtics forbade his soccer players to bless themselves on the field." He said, "The practice is acceptable elsewhere but not in Scotland" adding, "Religion is a private matter, and I want to nip it in the bud." This may be open to question, but what is **not** open to question is Jesus calling us to witness to the salvation of mankind. "Unless there is within us that which is above us, we shall soon yield to that which is about us." from Peter T. Forsyth taken from Mark Link SJ's "Mission" book. A Mission Appeal for the Missionary Diocese of Kumbakonam, India May 9/10 - There are 200 diocesan and 45 religious priests, 501 nuns, 25 trained lay catechists, and more than 120 catechists in training who are doing God's work in the diocese. The mission diocese celebrated its centenary in 1999 by setting goals for a New Evangelization: 1. Construction of 25 new parishes. At present, there are 92 parishes and 642 missions-stations. 2. The diocese needs to provide buildings and infra-structure for our schools in remote villages. 3. Primary tasks: Evangelization, Education, Medical, Social activities-reaching out to the needy, the sick, the homeless and the poor. 4. Orphanages: Education of 4000 very poor or orphan children from remote villages and mission parishes and free board & lodging. The diocese has been trying to materialize these missionary goals. The mission and spiritual prospects of Kumbakonam diocese are bright but its needs are great. Your generosity is our strength. My home diocese is in dire and desperate need of financial help to help the starving, the poor, the sick, the homeless, and especially to feed the poor kids in orphanages and for their education. I humbly request your prayers and generous donation from your heart for my home diocese. A very big thanks to you in advance for your great generosity! God bless!
