

From Deacon Don's desk:



There is a novel written by William Blatty called **Legion**. The part I will share follows: A Jewish detective is alone in a church, checking out the murder of a priest. Overwhelmed by the inhumanity of it all he sits down and shakes his head.

Then, slowly, he lifts his eyes to a crucifix hanging on the wall. As he gazes at the face of Jesus, his eyes soften and he says out loud; "Who are **You**? God's **Son**? No, You know I don't believe that. I just asked to be polite.....but who **are** You?" For us we ponder this question: Why do I believe Jesus is God's Son? A Japanese student once made a profound statement: "The strange thing about Jesus is that you can never get away from Him."

Father Rolheiser, OMI in Sunday's Tidings, "A primal understanding of **Eucharist**." A martyred Trappist Abbot at his 1st Communion said to his mother, "I don't understand what I'm doing." His mother said. "It's OK, you don't have to understand it now, later you will understand." At the first Eucharist at the Last Supper, Jesus didn't ask his disciples to understand what they were doing but celebrate it faithfully until He returned. During my seminary training, I took three major courses on the Eucharist and concluded I didn't understand the Eucharist and was happy enough with that because they **did** teach me how important it is that I celebrate and participate in the Eucharist. Perhaps this can be helpful in our search for what to say to some of our children and young people who no longer go to church. We hear the lament, "Why should I go to church, it doesn't mean anything to me?" British theologian, Ron Knox about the Eucharist says, "We have never, as Christians, been truly faithful to Jesus, no matter our denomination. None of us have truly followed those teachings which characterize Jesus: We haven't forgiven our enemies. We haven't purified our thoughts nor seen God in the poor. We haven't kept our hearts pure and free from things of this world. **But** we have, he says, been faithful in one very important way; we have kept the Eucharist going. The last thing Jesus asked us to do before He died was to have us keep celebrating Eucharist, "Do this in memory of me!

OUR PRAYER—Heavenly Father enable us to put on the attitude of **Your Son Jesus**. Grant that we may be **His** follower in all things on earth so that we may follow Him to heaven. Amen


