From Deacon Don's desk:

Today's readings give us courage even though they speak of failure and rejection because people resist God's word. Jesus' own family, friends and townspeople turn Him off. Jesus returns home. A crowd comes to the synagogue to hear Him speak.

Jesus appears ordinary, like one of them. But His words are amazing. His own kinspeople and townspeople do not have the faith of His followers. They do not see God's Spirit at work. Jesus, like Ezekiel and Paul, is distressed by the response of those He has been sent to save. But their rejection does not stop His mission. Jesus cures the sick and moves on to teach others. Have you ever felt hurt when trying to do something good for another? Nazareth did not value who was in its midst.

A Jesuit priest once said: "Today's Gospel also has a practical impact in our homes and work, where we don't get away with very much and where affirmation can be sparingly given. This can be taken to unhealthy extremes when parents and siblings or co-workers speak highly of others except brothers or sisters or a co-worker who deserves the praise. As Christians we should look for opportunities to build up and praise those we know and love and rightly deserve praise. It is too late for Nazareth after it rejected Jesus. But it's not too late for us. May it never be said we despised wise people who have something to teach us and whose gifts and talents reflect the power of God. 
