From the desk of Fr. Francis:

For the last three weeks, we have heard Jesus describe himself as the true spiritual food that will give us eternal life. In today's gospel, Jesus reminds us once again that in order for us to overcome the challenges that come be-

fore us (illness, tension in marriage, old age, financial crisis, family tension, school and work troubles) we must partake of the Eucharist, which is the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ. Whether we realize it or not, we are constantly feeding our minds, our hearts and our soul all kinds of food throughout the day. If you look around, there are many offers for food that don't come from the Lord, that apparently would satisfy us more. Young people are under constant pressure to do what everyone else is doing: drugs, alcohol and other things that they're not supposed to do and these are the "junk food" that promise to give them joy but it only leads to emptiness and brokenness inside.

If you're not careful, it will cause you to lower you standard and think, "Hey, everybody else is doing it. This is what's fun!" That's worldly food feeding you and putting to life what God wants you to put to death: immorality, revenge, anger, gossip. That's the false bread that Jesus speaks of. The good news is, instead of eating worldly food that appears attractive at times, Jesus wants you to recognize the "true spiritual food" that will give you eternal life - his body and blood found in the Eucharist each time you attend Mass. May you always partake of the Eucharist regularly to feed your soul and may you invite others to do the same, that the deepest longing of their heart may be fulfilled in Jesus Christ.

I also want to take this opportunity to once again thank all of you for your warm welcome and hospitality. I am slowly getting to know the different families that I am serving and I am looking forward to getting to know you guys as the months unfold. If I haven't had the opportunity of meeting you, please don't hesitate to introduce yourself after each Mass. I am at all the Masses shaking people's hands and conversing with them. From Deacon Don's desk: Many years ago I used to lister



Many years ago I used to listen to the news on I believe it was KFI. Two of the announcers laughed as they said Catholics are cannibals!! Father Leonard SJ addressed cannibalism by noting in the early 1970's a Readers Digest article told of

the jet crash in the Andes Mountains. Some of the survivors resorted to cannibalism. Question: In this case, is it amoral to eat another human being? The church has always been very careful in the language used about how Jesus is present in the Eucharist. We are NOT cannibals. We are not eating Jesus' liver, brain, and bones!! It is the glorified, Risen Christ who is wholly and truly present under the form of bread and wine at the Eucharist.

John's Gospel is a discourse on the Eucharist. For Jesus not only gives bread to the people, but also in His passion, death, and resurrection He gives us Himself. This is why the church always links the event at Easter with the celebration of Eucharist. Why do we have this unique gift? Eucharist is not a feast for the privileged few. It is something that empowers all Christians to go out and transform the world with love and goodness for the sake of Christ. Jesus tells us in the Gospel that He gives Himself "for the life of the world." The Eucharist is meant to make us committed to all God's people everywhere.
