St. Joseph Parish is a community of believers who uphold the teachings of the Gospel and the traditions of the Roman Catholic Church, foster the formation and enrichment of parishioners in spirituality, worship and education,

providing a welcoming environment to all.

We live Christian lives by praying together, caring for our diverse community, encouraging and sharing of ourselves in service to others. In today's gospel, the Pharisees criticized Jesus and his disciples for not washing their hands before eating a meal. But the Pharisees were not people of integrity. They claimed to love God but they cheated others. They were envious and they were dishonest. So Jesus told them that there is nothing that someone eats that makes him a sinner. Sin

Is nothing that someone eats that makes him a sinner. Sin comes from the hearts of people: adultery, stealing, infidelity, lying, envy, being too proud. These are the things that come out of the heart and make someone a sinner. Jesus is inviting us today to get our hearts in the right place; and one way we can do this is by being a person of integrity. A person of integrity is someone who lives a just and blameless life. Scripture says today in Psalm 15 that whoever walks without blame and who thinks the truth in his heart will live in the presence of the Lord. Many times throughout the day, our integrity will be put to the test in order to figure out if we truly have a heart like Christ or are we simply pretending to be kind and loving in front of others?

I've learned in life that it's easier to clean the pots and the pans than to clean one's heart. The Pharisees are concerned with washing hands. Jesus is concerned about washing feet. The law is not given to be kept for its own sake; the law is given to transform us into becoming more Christ-like. Today more than ever, Jesus is telling us to make a commitment to being a person of integrity. God promises us this: if we make a commitment to integrity, if we make a commitment right now to refocus our heart in obeying God's commands and doing what is right no matter what, in the long run, we'll have more joy and peace. We'll be more fulfilled. Our almighty God will lift us up and give us fullness of life.

From Deacon Don's desk:

The Second reading from James:1-2 "Be doers of the Word not hearers only....." TV celebrity Malcom Muggeridge interviewed Bl. Teresa of Calcutta. The verdict was that the interview was not usable. Bl. Teresa's delivery was halting, her ac-

cent was thick. One BBC official felt the interview had a mysterious power and aired it on a Sunday night. Response to the program was amazing both in terms of mail and contributions. It was not the eloquence of Mother Teresa but the "convincing proof of the power of God's Spirit."

Today's Gospel is similar to Jesus' State of the Union address. Like the U.S. President, Jesus may have done the local equivalent of shaking hands when He came in, but He received no standing ovations for what He said, and he had to fight to get out alive when He was done! Have you heard any current political leader say that his policies are going to be good news for the poor, that he wants to let prisoners go free, make sure the oppressed are given justice and heal the sick. But, He was going to do all this for the nations around us whom we despise. Fr. Leonard SJ says, "The work of salvation is God's, every time we seem to have worked out precisely who can and cannot board the 'salvation train' God usually undermines our expectations, judgments, and prejudices. Christ is always there for us, but His kingdom only comes alive in our communities when we admit we are poor, we want to be set free, we want to see how the world actually is, we seek an end to oppression and we face up to the ways in which we oppress others. May the Eucharist, this meal of those of us who know we need Christ, help us to work for the kingdom He actually proclaimed and not the one we constantly try to build in its place."

OUR PRAYER: Father, help us to seek values that will bring us lasting joy in this changing world. In our desire for what You promise make us one in mind and heart. Grant this through Christ Your Son our Lord, who lives & reigns with you & the Holy Spirit one God, for ever and ever. Amen
