

#### From Deacon Don's desk:



In my early Catechism days, our Carmelite nuns brought us to the baptismal font to teach us how to make the sign of the cross. When my turn came I put my finger in the holy water. Suddenly she grabbed my hand and dunked my hand into the

water saying, "Don't be Stingy!!" Since that time I have put at least 3 fingers and many times my whole hand. Why do I bring this up? Well, an article caught my eye titled "It's the Water." Here is some of that observation from the Orange Co Catholic. "Most Catholics do it without a conscious thought: step inside church, dip a finger or fingers lightly into the holy water, make the Sign of the Cross, and sit down. It's a habit as automatic as shaking hands or salting french fries. A simple movement, but with the water it becomes one of the most powerful declarations in Christianity. Holy water when blessed by the priest is known as a sacramental (a sacred sign that only resembles the sacraments, it doesn't confer the grace of the Holy Spirit). Fr William Saunders says, "Though not a sacrament but like a sacrament helps the faithful to sanctify each moment of life and to live in the paschal mystery of our Lord." He says, "It symbolizes 3 things: A) REPENTANCE of sin, the Ritual washing. He sites Psalm 50 in part "Have mercy on me, O God, in your goodness; in the greatness of your compassion wipe away my offense. Thoroughly wash me from my guilt and of my sin cleanse me." B) PROTECTS FROM EVIL, Tradition has held that holy water is a substantial force for keeping evil at bay. Saint Teresa of Avila wrote: "From long experience I have learned that there is nothing like holy water to put devils to flight and prevent them from coming back. They also flee from the Cross". C) BAPTISM: "In making the Sign of the Cross with holy water, we are mindful that we are called to renew those baptismal promises of rejecting Satan and all his works, and all his empty promises, and to profess our creedal faith. We then can repent and offer our prayers and worship to God with pure and contrite hearts." In funerals, we sprinkle the body with water at the beginning of a funeral ceremony, and bless the rings of marriage with holy water during the ceremony. All of this is to be a reminder of the baptismal sacrament. Holy water connects all these things to the mystery of our involvement in the life of the Church.

OUR PRAYER Lord Jesus, let us frequently have recourse to You in the Blessed Sacrament. O Sacrament most holy, O Sacrament divine, all praise and all thanksgiving be every moment Thine. "Come to the tabernacle, and you will always find strength and consolation":...St Peter Eymard
