From the Administrator's desk:

It's been a while since I've shared my reflection with all of you and I've missed it. It's hard to believe that I've actually been here for over 4 months. I feel like I've been here forever. I am so thankful to all of you in your commitment to ministry, discipleship and fulfilling the mission that God has entrusted to us, specifically build-



ing God's kingdom here at St. Joseph and becoming the holy, healthy and vibrant people that God created us to be. Just like any family, I am still getting to know many of you and your needs and how to best serve those needs. I am also grateful to God because of the wonderful staff and ministry leaders that He has provided for our church. One of the new things that we are doing with our staff is that each month, we are celebrating someone's birthday just to show them our appreciation in their commitment to the mission of St. Joseph.

And that's why we are all here in this church. We all come from different backgrounds and yet we gather together as one big supernatural family. And our task is to give completely of ourselves without counting the cost. In this Sunday's gospel Jesus is observing how people of his time were making donations to the treasury. The scribes gave from their surplus and the poor widow gave everything that she had. This Sunday I invite all of you to see the joy of giving. Some people might say, "Well if I had more money, then I would be more generous and give a lot away." But that's where some people are missing the point. That's what the scribes did in today's gospel, but Jesus warns his disciples not to follow the example of the scribes.

God calls you to start where you are, just like the poor widow. You must be faithful with what you have - then God will trust you with more. You may not have a lot of money to give but you can buy someone's dinner every once in a while. You can give somebody a kind word. You can go out of your way to pray for somebody in need. You can also volunteer your time at convalescent homes. You can serve at soup kitchens. You can visit the hospitals especially patients who don't have families to visit them. Once you learn to give - you will begin to experience God's blessings in different areas in your life. You will begin to see what really matters in this world. When you are giving your time to serve food to men and women in a homeless shelter, you realize how lucky you are that you still have a home to live in. When you volunteer your time at a hospital and attend to someone who just got a severe burn, you begin to understand that being stuck in traffic or being delayed for 5 minutes or 30 minutes is not the worst thing in the world. As we prepare for Thanksgiving in the next couple of weeks, may we all develop an attitude of giving. God bless you all! Fr. Francis

From Deacon Don's desk:



I'd like to share a couple of items to meditate upon: Fr. Rolheiser OMI began last week's "Displacing ego and narcissism" "The Buddhists have an axiom that explains more about ourselves than we would like. They say that you can under-

stand most of what's wrong in the world and inside yourself by looking at a group photo. Invariably you will look first at how you turned out before looking at whether or not this is a good photo of the group. Basically, we assess the quality of things on the basis of how we are doing." Something to think about. October 28 was the feast of Saints Simon and Jude, Apostles. Fr. Richard Nichols, S.J. wrote: "Their remains are kept together in St. Peter's Basilica. Of the two, St Jude is more well-known. We think of St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital, although it is a hospital without any religious affiliation, though its founder was Catholic. There is a New Testament epistle that bears Jude's name though it remains somewhat obscure. It's an encyclical letter like popes write today but it only has 25 verses compared to Laudato Si which has 176 pages. Here's a couple of verses from St. Jude: "Remember beloved, the predictions of the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ; they said to you: 'in the last time there will be scoffers with their ungodly passions.' These set up divisions, devoid of the Spirit. But you, beloved, build yourselves up on your most holy faith; pray to the Holy Spirit; keep yourselves in the love of God; wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life." Father Nichols recommends the whole encyclical "it's a quick read." It's found in last part of New Testament just before Revelation.

Scripture Focus for 32nd Sunday: In Mark's Gospel, the widow contributed "all that she had to live on." The rich do not depend on God, they have a lot to live on. Question: From your experience, what are some of the practical ways you can contribute to the Church besides money? Hmm, Movement for a Better World?

OUR PRAYER: Heavenly Father, help us to be grateful to You for all the good things You have given us. Let us also be grateful to all those who help us in our earthly pilgrimage to our heavenly Kingdom.

PS: Tina and I visited Project Achieve. You would be impressed, as we were, of the abundance of well prepared food that Victoria Higgins and her crew served last week. Blessings to Victoria and team. It's been 10 years that Saint Joseph has served food for Project Achieve.
