

From Deacon Don's desk:

Last Monday we celebrated the dedication of the Lateran Basilica, Pope Francis' parish church. If you read the reflection in the "Living Faith" booklet you will note that the church of St. John Lateran has a close connection with the life of St. Fran-

cis of Assisi. This is the "seat" aka "cathedra" in which the Pope will sit when he proclaims a saint or an important law. I really want to thank Deacon Shane for training new Altar Servers. A Cardinal once said: "To serve at the altar is next to the priesthood, the highest privilege which is next to the priesthood, the highest privilege a person can enjoy. The Alter Server represents the faithful and takes an intimate part in the rich treasures of the church liturgy. This should be carried out with devotion, dignity and attention to detail." Altar servers must show utmost respect and reverence through dress and behavior because they are privileged to walk into the sanctuary – a holy place. This means, listening attentively and in a state of prayer with hands in a prayerful position. They stand near the altar on which the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. They should humble themselves and bow each time they pass the altar of sacrifice: they are assisting at the Holy of Holies. (A little tip - genuflect at the tabernacle, bow at the altar.) By showing reverence you receive blessings from God the Father of Jesus our Savior. Thank you for considering this awesome service.

OUR PRAYER: Heavenly Father, we ask Your blessings upon us, especially our **altar servers**, that they may service with reverence, attention, and love, and in so doing bring others to do the same. In Your Son's name. Amen


ESTHER MINISTRY - The
