

From the desk of Fr. Francis:

Today we celebrate a very beautiful feast, the Solemnity of Christ the King. This is the last Sunday of the church year. Through this feast the church is saying that all of our celebrations can be summed up in one statement: "Jesus is our King." He sits enthroned as King of Kings. He gives us the blueprint of how



we are to live every day of our lives. And today - more than ever - he reminds us of our mission on earth. Our mission is to testify to the truth - and that Jesus Christ is the truth Himself. We do this so that others may come to believe in Him and may have eternal life.

Did you know that there are a lot of things people can get away with in life and still be acceptable in society's eyes? They can cheat and lie and not testify to Jesus Christ and they can compromise their personal integrity and still be acceptable in society's eyes. They can cut corners - compromise their moral values and still be good in society's eyes. I went online to see why people lie and cheat and steal and there were articles promoting the 'advantage of cheating and lying.' The point of our beautiful feast of Christ the King is that we are not here on earth so we can measure up to society's standards. No - because society's standards are low. We are here to measure up to God's standards. Remember when Jesus came - He raised the bar. So the question is how high do you want to go? How much of God's love - His blessings - His favor - His peace - do you want to experience in your life? How much do you want God to use you, your talents and your resources? Understand this - God cannot raise you up in victory - he cannot give you the great things he has in store for you and your loved ones - if you are not testifying to the truth - if you not listening to His voice.

This solemnity invites us to renew our commitment to serve Him with all our hearts. It invites us to renew our self-giving stance as disciples who follow our King. In our self-giving we are transformed, and as we are transformed - so is the world because He has made us into a kingdom. At the end of this liturgical year we are invited once again to fall in love with our King - the truth Himself - who has won for us eternal life. To him be glory, honor and power forever and ever. Amen!

against the Roman empire. Jesus reinterprets what kingship means. It is not political in character!

Note Jesus' statement that He came to testify to the truth. His kingdom (the reign of God) will not be fully realized on earth. There will always be evil and enemies of the good. Jesus **is** king, and shares power with God (in Hebrew "sits at God's right hand"). In heaven He constantly intercedes for us "and waits until His enemies are made His footstool" (Heb 10:13) which will happen at the end of time. "Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to My voice." Jn 18:37

Pope Pius XI only established the feast of Christ the King in the Holy Year of 1925. Though rooted in an ancient devotion, this feast seems to have roots in the 1880's when European bishops worried about the rise of secularization and how governments were asserting power over the church. Especially in France and Italy, bishops began venerating Jesus as the Universal King. By 1922 at the Eucharistic Congress in Rome, 69 cardinals petitioned the pope to establish this feast.
