

From the desk of Fr. Francis:

Greetings everyone,

I think that most of us are in the middle of Christmas preparations. We are trying to get cards out and gifts bought and wrapped. We are preparing for parties, baking cookies, getting ready for the celebration. The celebration is the birth of Christ, the Divine Presence given to each and everyone of us. We have to remind ourselves continually that this is the purpose of our preparation. In just a few days, we will be celebrating the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary in which Pope Francis will commence with the Jubilee Year of Mercy. As we commence with this celebration it reminds us of how great God's mercy is. Let's face it. We all make mistakes in life and fall into sin. It's easy to live in guilt and regret and not feel worthy of God's mercy. But the good news is, no matter what you've done in the past, God is always ready to receive you with His open arms. All you need to do on your part is to return to Him.

Some of you today, you're down on yourself. You're not where you thought you would be in life. You wish you were more involved in church. You've made some poor choices and now everyone seems to turn their back on you. Now you're letting the guilt weigh you down. That heaviness is keeping your from being the best disciple that God created you to be. But here is the good news. When you fall, God doesn't turn away from you, he comes - running towards you. When you mess up, God doesn't say, "Too bad - you had your chance - now your life is over!" No! Instead - God comes after you - with a greater passion. When you fall into sin and recognize the wrong you've done and seek His mercy - He will go after you and He won't leave you alone, until He sees you restored - until He sees you reconciled with Him and with others - until you find your way back home and back on the right track.

As we prepare for the birth of our savior, may we remember God's mercy waiting for all of us. May our valleys be filled and our mountains and hills be leveled, may our winding roads be made straight, and the rough ways of our lives be made smooth, so that the Messiah may rush into our lives unimpeded. And may we see the salvation of our God in the very life that we live. God bless you all!

From Deacon Don's desk:

John clearly tells us how we are saved: seek "repentance for the forgiveness of sins." Our work of repentance is a matter of turning ourselves toward the God who embraces us in mercy and forgiveness and welcomes us home. We are called to

hear the "word of God" and act upon it. Do we? How well do we? Changing our lives to live more faithfully the Gospel values is not easy. Like John the Baptist we are to hear the word of God as it challenges us to embrace and let it take root in a more Godlike way of living.

You may have read this before, but it bears repeating: Farmers hope for lots of rain right after they plant their corn. Once it sprouts and gets a good start, they hope for a "dry spell." The reason is to force the corn's roots to grow downward in search of water, rather than stay on the surface. Unless the tap root of the corn grows downward to the "water level," the corn will wither and dry when the heat of the summer sets in--it will have no way to draw up water. Our prayer life is like that. God usually gives us a good start. Then God lets a "dry spell" set in to force our prayer roots to grow downward to the **faith** level, rather than stay on the surface at the **feeling** level. Fr. Mark Link, SJ asks: "Why must prayer be primarily an exercise of faith rather than of feeling?"

OUR PRAYER: Lord Jesus, help us to avoid being lukewarm in our spiritual life. Grant us an ardent faith, hope, and love so that we may be zealous in following You every step of the way. Amen

Jubilee Year of Mercy

This Tuesday, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, Pope Francis will open the "Holy Door" in Saint Peter's Basilica, symbolically opening the Jubilee Year of Mercy. In today's scriptures, Baruch confidently anticipates God's healing of the brokenness of humanity, and Paul sees God bringing our



discernment, knowledge, and love to fulfillment. Our experience of life and of ourselves can make such prophecies seem wildly optimistic, even hopelessly naïve. Pope Francis challenges us to live this Jubilee Year as a graced time, when God's mercy reawakens our enthusiasm to live our baptismal call as gospel people, our hope renewed and ourselves recommitted to selfless charity. Notice that in Luke's Gospel today, God bypasses the religious elite and politically powerful to speak to a humble believer in the barren desert the saving word that will transform history. So God's mercy continues to accomplish humanity's salvation in and through ordinary, flawed, and least likely instruments—even us.




