And today, God calls upon each one of us to share our gifts with our brothers and sisters that are in need of them. Through Together in Mission, we can do amazing things for others like that mother who was worried about her child's school closing down and not receiving the faith formation that she received.

Though our church is large, our strength is found not in numbers but in our compassion and ability to respond. Every gift, regardless of the size, matters so long as we give what we can and answer the calling of our faith.

I have no doubt in my mind that together we can make sure God's love and presence are felt by all, especially those in need.


Will you join me in assisting those parishes and schools that cannot survive without outside financial support? God bless you for your generous response and support.

Jubilee Year of Mercy

Mary, whom Catholic tradition names "Mother of Mercy," at Cana intercedes with her Son to show mercy toward the bridal couple: "Son, they have no wine." But he does more! Jesus' transformation of water into wine is a "sign" (John's term for "miracle") that God's marriage with the whole human race has begun in Jesus' person



and ministry, a marriage that will be consummated on the cross: "It is finished"--we are saved! But before Jesus acts, Mary instructs the servers to prepare the way for Jesus' miracle of mercy: "Do whatever he tells you." During this Jubilee Year of Mercy, Mother Church, like Mother Mary, instructs us to share the Spirit's manifold gifts--some of which Paul lists in today's second reading--in generous service to the human family. Thus we prepare the way for Jesus' new miracles of mercy, transforming life's sometimes stagnant water into the refreshing wine of God's mercy.



From Deacon Don's desk:

Have you put away all of your Christmas ornaments? It's time to slow down a bit. Sister Svoboda SND says "It's good to recall what Jesus did amid the busyness of His daily life, He went off to a deserted place, where **He Prayed**." Still too

busy? Stop and catch your breath and reflect on today's Gospel: Jesus and Mary and His disciples are at the wedding feast of Cana. Recall the incident where Mary says to the stewards, "**Do whatever He tells you**." Take time to meditate on these 5 words. What is He telling you?"

Blessed Teresa of Calcutta once said: "God keeps on loving the world. He keeps on sending you and me to prove that He loves the world, that He still has compassion for the world. It is we who have to be His love, His compassion in the world of today. But to be able to love, we must have **faith**, for **faith** in action is **love**, and **love** in action is **service**.

...Believe that **He**, Jesus, is in the appearance of Bread and He, Jesus, is the hungry, naked, sick, lonely, unloved, home-less, helpless and hopeless."
