From Deacon Don's desk:

Last Sunday, Monsignor Kevin gave us a test on the Beatitudes. I'm still trying to memorize them. I did not know that Matthew's Gospel on the Beatitudes appears twice in our liturgical year. Don't be surprised if Msgr. springs a test on us on All

Saints day in November.

I read that one of Matthew's goals in writing to a predominantly Jewish Christian audience about 80 to 90 AD was to show how the reward of the kingdom of heaven is open to all, including Gentiles who acknowledge Jesus as the Son of God. Matthew's version of the Beatitudes, and especially one in particular, Blessed are the poor in spirit, serves his purpose of showing that the kingdom of heaven is available to Jew and Gentile alike. Happiness from living out the Beatitudes (beatitudo in Latin means "happy") is a reward that God **will** give in the future to those who have been, are, and will be faithful. The Beatitudes inform us that the kingdom of heaven is available **now** to those who are dedicated to following Jesus and living by His teachings even if they are not part of the inner circle of disciples, or are not canonized saints. From these Beatitudes, we who are part of the "multitude" of the faithful can draw strength and inspiration thus growing close to Jesus (CCC. 956)

I would like to give a heartfelt gratitude to Dick and CeCe who were true "helping hands" through our journey to those in need in LA. Also David and his two able body boys, Nathaniel and Jonathan, who helped box the sandwiches. Our good Missionary of Charity nuns had a prior commitment, so Tina and I had
