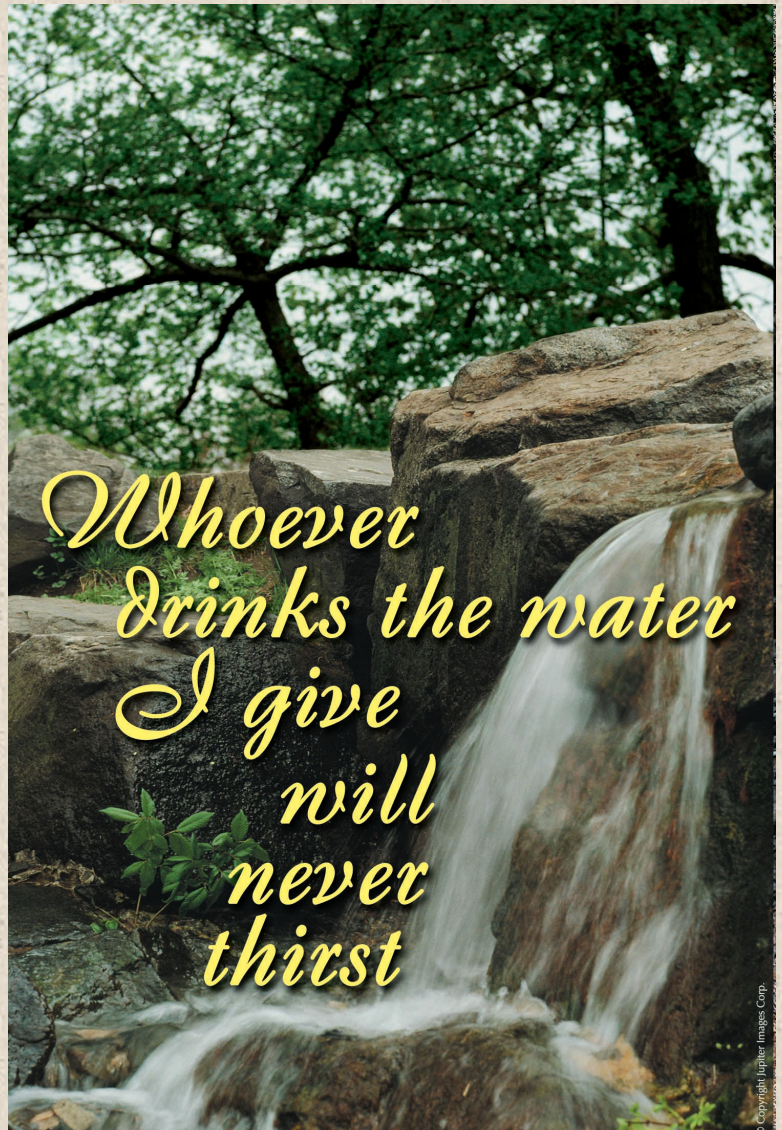

Third Sunday of Lent

March 19, 2017

St. Joseph Parish is a community of believers who uphold the teachings of the Gospel and the traditions of the Roman Catholic Church, foster the formation and enrichment of parishioners in spirituality, worship and education, providing a welcoming environment to all. We live Christian lives by praying together, caring for our diverse community, encouraging and sharing of ourselves in service to others.



What is the Church's official position concerning penance and abstinence from meat during Lent? Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and

Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting as explained by the U.S. bishops means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening—depending on when a person chooses to eat the main or full meal. Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat. Abstinence does not include meat juices and liquid foods made from meat. Thus, such foods as chicken broth, consommé, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies or sauces, as well as seasonings or condiments made from animal fat are not forbidden. So it is permissible to use margarine and lard. Even bacon drippings which contain little bits of meat may be poured over lettuce as seasoning. Moral theologians remind us that some people are excused from fasting and/or abstinence because of sickness or other reasons.

Lenten Observance

Catholics are encouraged to participate in the Eucharistic liturgy and in the sacrament of reconciliation during Lent. Likewise encouraged are devotions such as Stations of the Cross, vigils and prayer services. Traditional practices - including increased prayer, Scripture and spiritual reading, alms, personal self-denial in food and drink, increased care and service to the sick and needy - are also suggested.

Every Friday of Lent we will have the stations of the cross in the church at 7:00 pm.

The drone of conversation competed with the steady flow of dots and dashes of the teletype in the background. The door opened, and yet another applicant entered the room. He stood for a minute, walked over to a door marked "Private" and knocked. A man opened it and said to the others, "You may all go home now, we have our applicant." The others were furious and demanded an explanation, after all they had been waiting for a long time. The man said, "Listen!" They did. The dots and dashes kept repeating over and over again, **"If you hear this, come in; the job is yours."**

The story reminds us that God is constantly speaking to us, but we are **not** listening. God wants to be part of our lives, so much so that He lays down His life for us, His sheep. Can we find the presence of Christ, the Good Shepherd, in those we meet?

OUR PRAYER: Father God, You have given us Your Son. Help us to listen more frequently to Jesus, Your word. Help us to enter more fully into the mystery of Your Anointed One and through the help of St. Joseph the just and upright man. Amen

Did You Know? Parents should be aware of laundry pod dangers - Risks to children's safety come in many shapes and sizes. As parents and caring adults, inappropriate adult conduct is not the only risk to watch for; we must also create safe environments to protect children from other risks. One possible threat comes from the small soft plastic pods that hold laundry detergent. The pods are brightly colored, and often attract young children who may mistake them for candy or other foods, and according to studies, children who ingest these pods or are exposed to them could become ill and need to be hospitalized.
