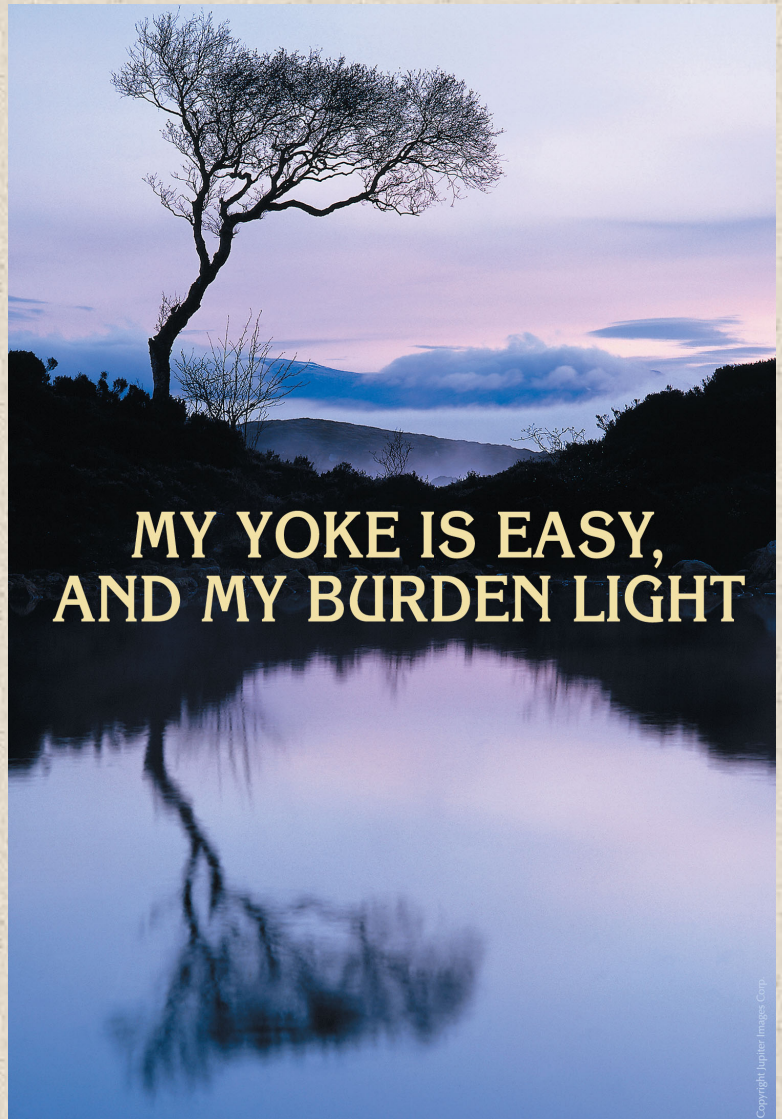

The Miracle of LIFE

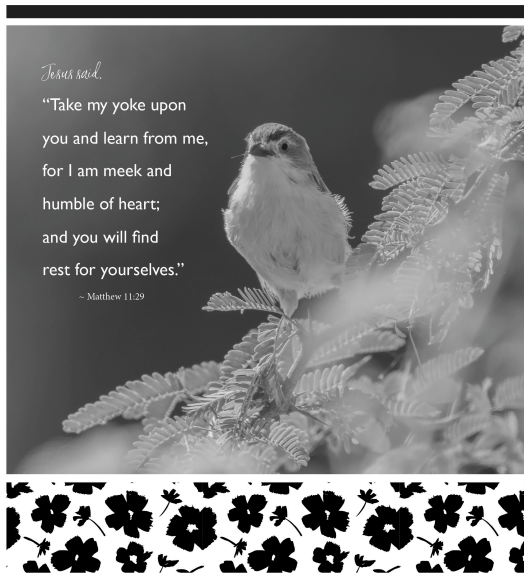
The human body is the most complicated and incredible machine in the world.

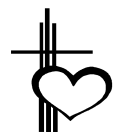
Women and Men of St. Joseph Parish

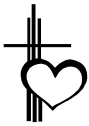
