From Deacon Don's desk:



"A Priest's Confession"

Where are all these families now? Some are or will be in Church this weekend. Some are away on vacation, hopefully attending Mass elsewhere. But many, perhaps over half, simply do not put

enough value on the **Eucharist** to attend Mass regularly. They will respond, "We are good people. We believe in God and that is all that matters." But the problem with their argument is that there is no place for God's greatest gift, the **Eucharist** in their lives. The awe, the respect, the reverence for the Eucharist is missing from their lives.

But I do not have to look to others. There are times that the reverence for the Eucharist is not all it should be in my life, as perhaps also in yours. Too often I prepare for Mass focusing on the homily while not remembering that far more important than the homily is the reception of the Word Made Flesh in Communion. Perhaps, too often you join the line to receive communion without taking the time to consider what you are doing or whom you are receiving. Too often people receive communion and then head for the doors to beat the parking lot traffic.

The solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord was established in the thirteenth century to promote respect and reverence for the Eucharist. The celebration has retained its purpose. We need to stop today and consider our reception of communion. We need to ask God to rekindle in us and in our people awe, the respect and the reverence that is fundamental to understanding the reality of the sacrament of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

To which kingdom do we choose to belong? A king who wears a gold crown or a king who wears a crown of thorns. A king that carries not a scepter but a cross and not born in a palace but in a stable?

OUR PRAYER: Almighty Father, help us to show gratitude to You for all the good things You have done for us. Let us be always grateful to all who help us on our earthly journey to Your heavenly Kingdom. Amen

Giving children the experience of the Liturgy of the Word in their own environment, we are allowing them to hear the same readings the rest of the community hears but on their own level, and to engage in a dialogue about those readings to make connections to their own life.

We are always on the lookout for volunteers. The wonderful thing about volunteering for this ministry is that it is an easy commitment. Our leaders are young adults, grandparents, moms and dads.

We are all busy, but this is one ministry that is so important for our children. Once the schedule is made, you and a team of two other adults will lead a session every 4 weeks or so. Did You Know? Neglect is a common form of abuse -

Neglect is the most common form of child abuse. It is the failure to meet a child's basic needs, including housing, food, clothing, education, safety, and access to health care. Neglect is most often characterized by acts of omission that aren't easy to see. The signs of neglect are wide and varied, and may include: failure to develop and grow appropriately, or malnourishment, among infants; wearing inadequate clothing for the weather; and children who seem to be wholly responsible for the welfare of their siblings. If you know that any type of abuse is occurring, or if a child discloses to you, it is important to communicate these concerns to the appropriate authorities. Call your local law enforcement or child protective services department to report suspected abuse of any kind.
