The weekend of February 10 - 11, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles will celebrate Together in Mission commitment Sunday. Last year our Parish goal was \$66,700 and your response was over-the-top as we collected 161% of our goal. This year our parish goal has been raised to \$71,646. We can do this!

From Deacon Don's desk:

Father Leonard SJ caught my eye when he wrote the following :

Sometimes when we think we are making a little progress in the spiritual life we can become aware of all the destructive things within us. In this regard we are in very good company. Nearly every mystic in the Church's history reports the same pattern: The closer they felt to God, the more aware of sin they became. It stands to figure, doesn't it? The more light there is in a room, the more sharply defined dark corners become. Rather than be discouraged by our growing spiritual awareness, we can see it as a step in the right direction.

In Mark's Gospel the evil spirits regularly recognize who Jesus is before anyone else does. The light highlights the dark. In today's Gospel the unclean asks Jesus an interesting question, "Have you come to destroy us?" We know that this is precisely what Jesus comes to do for us - to destroy the power of evil destruction, and death in our lives. Some Christians are prone these days to doubt the existence of evil. This is a mistake. It follows surely from the Christian belief in free choice, that evil IS a reality and some people can, and do, give themselves to its work.

We don't need to give it undue attention, for we believe that the power of good will win in the end. The reality of evil is the only way I can begin to explain Hitler, Stalin and Pol Pot. And I'm sure there is even destructive behavior much closer to home.

When we were baptized in Christ, on our behalf our parents were asked, "Do you reject Satan and all his works....and his empty promises?"

Most of us are not given over to grand acts evil promises. Evil often promises us greed in place of generosity, envy in place of admiration, revenge in place of forgiveness.

So let's pray that we can work out the patterns of the bad spirit and change them, respond firmly and quickly when we see destructive behavior, and see the task as a lifelong project.

OUR PRAYER: Heavenly Father, You have given us the **Eucharist** as our food for heavenly life. Help us to partake of it often and so be strengthened on our pilgrim journey on earth. Amen
