

This Wednesday we commence the 40 day season of Lent. This campaign to holiness is our annual exercise to conform our lives to Jesus Christ! The Ash Wednesday Mass schedule and regulations regarding fasting are below.

Let's make it a Great Lent!

Ash Wednesday Mass Schedule

Mass and distribution of ashes will be held on Wednesday, February 14 at: 8:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m. with the school children, noon, and 7:00 p.m.

Stations of the Cross / Holy Hour - This Lent we will be incorporating Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament into our Friday Stations of the Cross. The Blessed Sacrament will be Exposed at approximately 6:40 pm, allowing parishioners the opportunity to spend some quiet time in adoration before praying the Stations of the Cross. The Stations, which will still begin at 7:00 pm, will take place in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Following the Stations of the Cross, the liturgy will close with Benediction, a solemn blessing imparted through the Blessed Sacrament. Come and spend some time with Jesus this Lent!



Abstinence and Fasting

Abstinence from eating meat is to be observed on all Fridays during Lent. This applies to all persons 14 & older. The law of fasting on Ash Wednesday

and Good Friday applies to all persons 18 or older and younger than 59. Fasting means that one full meatless meal per day may be eaten. Two other meatless meals may be taken sufficient to maintain strength, but together they should not equal a full meal. Liquids, including milk and fruit juice, may be taken between meals. If health or ability to work are affected, fasting does not oblige.

Private, self-imposed observance of fasting on Lenten weekdays is strongly recommended. Pastors and parents should ensure that children who are not bound by the laws of fast and abstinence are taught an authentic sense of penance, conversion and reconciliation.

Lenten Observance

We are encouraged to participate in the Eucharistic liturgy and in the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Lent. Likewise encouraged are devotions such as Stations of the Cross, vigils and prayer services. Traditional practices - increased prayer, Scripture and spiritual reading, alms, personal self-denial in food and drink, increased care and service to the sick and needy - are also suggested.

From Deacon Don's desk:



Scripture Focus for this Sunday, taken from our Small Church Community:

According to Jewish law, lepers were considered unclean and were outcasts from society. Yet in today's Gospel, Jesus immediately responds to a

leper's request for healing. Jesus had great respect for the Law of Moses, so he told the leper to fulfill the cleansing requirements by offering sacrifice and appearing before the priest. Jesus orders him to tell no one who cured him, but the leper ignores Jesus' command and tells everyone what happened. In spite of the growing difficulties of His ministry, Jesus continues healing and preaching. He was able to proceed, because people had faith in Him.

In Fr Leonard, SJ's reflection on this Gospel he says, "Lepers were treated shamefully, they had to live outside the villages and towns; they could never enter the Temple. There are two details in this Gospel that are important. The man with leprosy feels comfortable enough to go straight to Jesus and ask for healing. Jesus touched him. Religious laws were broken in this encounter. Jesus tells him to fulfill his religious obligations so that he can attend the Temple again and rejoin the community. Jesus was only interested in the higher laws of love and compassion.

We are challenged this Sunday to trust holy anger. This is not only about fighting for our rights when we have been wronged, but it's fighting for the dignity and rights of others. This can take many forms: taking the lot of those yet to be born or who are near natural death, fighting for future generations by calling for a just care of the earth. It's about standing up for those who are in our neighborhood, parish, workplace, country and world who are treated shamefully, excluded, derided or declared unclean. Why should we bother? Because this Sunday Christ comes to us again and declares that despite what we might think about ourselves, or what we have been told, there is nothing in us that cannot be healed or is beyond hope.

May the Eucharist give us the love and compassion of Christ to fight for others' dignity because of the dignity we've received from Him. May Jesus turn us into 'agents of change' for a more just Church and world. Amen OUR PRAYER: St Augustine says, Entrust the past to God's mercy, the present to His love, and the future to His providence. We pray that the all-provident God entrusts our whole life to His loving care. Amen


