From Deacon Don's Desk:

In today's Gospel is a key passage in Mark, a sort of hinge between the first and second parts of his Gospel The first part is all about reactions to Jesus, looking forward to his final rejection in Jerusalem. In today's passage, we get the reaction of

His own disciples, a crucial reaction. Peter, who appears to speak for all the disciples, gives a clear and direct reply. Jesus is the Messiah. But Jesus suspects that Peter's idea of a Messiah is off the mark. Jesus predicts the Passion that will be the backbone of the next section. The emphasis will now be on the suffering Son of Man. Peter's idea of a popular political Messiah gets a public reprimand from Jesus. This leads to the first of three instructions on discipleship. All share the fact that following Jesus will mean suffering with Him through a life of selfless love.

OUR PRAYER: Lord Jesus by Your death and Resurrection You take away the sins of the world. Grant us true repentance for all our sins and a firm resolve never more to commit them. Amen
