Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a process and a journey, which leads adults into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ within the Catholic Church. People

who can choose to make this journey include those who may be unbaptized, those baptized in other faith traditions, and baptized Catholics who wish to receive additional sacraments. We welcome those interested in becoming members of the Catholic Church, as well as those Catholics who have been away from the practice of their faith and are considering a return to active participation.

The RCIA is modeled after the
Catechumenate of the early Church when adults
who sought entry into the Church went through
various periods of growth and formation. Our
Catechumens and candidates meet regularly for
prayer, faith sharing and study of Catholic beliefs.
A person may continue to participate in these
sessions as long as he or she wishes. Through Sacred
Rites, which are held at successive intervals, the
Inquirer is introduced into the life of faith, liturgy
and love, and when ready, receives the Sacraments
of initiation (at the Easter Vigil).

#### Did you know

The right kind of touch is important for children. Children are often naturally affectionate and trusting, and this can lead to unexpected hugs or touches that indicate their love for the adults in their lives. For adults who are aware that some touching can be inappropriate or can appear to be a boundary violation even though it was initiated by the child, it can be difficult to respond in these instances.

Healthy, appropriate touch is important for children. Use these instances as teachable moments where you can affirm your affection in words and guide an appropriate touch by description and example. Some examples of this could include patting a child on the shoulder or back, high fives, holding hands out of the classroom or when crossing the street, or helping a young child tie his shoelaces.
