

#### Did you Know

Understanding community grooming Like the psychological grooming we discussed last week, community grooming is another way a predator inserts himself into the life of his child victim. In community grooming, the predator develops a rapport with the community surrounding his victims, appearing to be kind, generous, and caring. This can often lead to increased levels of trust from adults around the victim, and increased access to the victim.

The predator uses manipulation and lies to build a false image of good, which makes it harder for victims to come forward to express discomfort or report an allegation. 




