# Letter From Our Pastor

Dear Parish Family:

Welcome to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent. As we journey with St. Luke in his Gospel, he introduces us to St. John the Baptist, the cousin of Jesus who is telling the people to make straight a path for the Lord. The Baptist calls the people to metanoia, which means "change". Advent is also the time when God wants us to change, to be more like his Son, Jesus Christ who birthday we celebrate in less than three weeks!!

Thanks to the 150+ parishioners who came to hear Deacon Steve Greco. He inspired us with his reflections and he got us all singing! May his ministry and love for the Lord continue to grow and inspire others.

Today, Sunday, December 8th is normally a Holyday honoring the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who is our national Patroness. The Sunday of Advent takes precedence over a Solemnity or Feast. The Holy See has communicated, "That the Feast must be observed as a day of Obligation by being transferred to Monday, December 9. The Vigil Mass for the Holy Day cannot be celebrated at any hour on Sunday, December 8." Therefore, we will have two Holyday Masses in honor of Our Lady on Monday, December 9 at 8:00 AM and 7:00 PM. In accord with the canonical directives from Rome, there will be no Vigil Mass on Sunday night.

Movement for a Better Worlds Annual Christmas Present Drive begins this weekend. The Christmas trees are set up in the Church and they've been decorated with envelopes with information about one child from the 108 families we'll be supporting as a parish community for Christmas. A tree will be set up by the outside gate for the 8:30 Mass. Please take one or more of the envelopes, buy a present for the child, wrap the gift with Christmas paper and most importantly, bring the

gift to the church or the parish office by 12:30 PM next Sunday, December 16. You'll also see that gift cards are an option for the older children. Thank you for supporting these families and we will be meeting at Saint Cornelius on Saturday, December 21 at 8:15 AM for distribution of all the boxes of food and gifts to the families.

Like many of your households, St. Joseph's had to pay our property taxes this past week. The taxes continue to climb and for the 2024-2025 year, your parish property taxes are \$16,038.24!!! Please start praying and discerning about your Annual Christmas gift – your generous Christmas gift is a blessing with all the increased expenses we are incurring!!

# Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In the year 1995, in the seventeenth year of my life, when Fife Symington was governor of Arizona, Bill Clinton was president of the United States, Chuck Keiffer was pastor of St. Theresa parish in Phoenix, Arizona, and Ron and Mary were my parents, the word of God came to my youth minister Eric and through him I started to see the salvation of God. Soon, Christ came into my life never to leave. I'm thankful beyond words.

Why am I being so specific, you ask? Because in the Gospel this week we hear the specific names of people holding civic and religious authority in first century Palestine when "the word of God came to John the Baptist:" Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate, Herod, Philip, Lysanias, Annas, Caiaphas, and Zechariah. All this is meant to help us see that God breaks into our history, into real human events. Jesus is no mere myth. He is the Word-which-breaks-in, in concrete moments, you might say. And now we anticipate his coming once again in our specific situations.

Advent challenge: Name as many civic and religious leaders who are in authority currently in your life. Now, name who the potential John the Baptists may be. A spouse? A friend? A podcaster? A work colleague who brings God's word to you? Spend a moment considering that this comprises the concrete, historical setting into which Christ wishes to come. Then, with these specifics in mind, pray: "Come, Lord Jesus. Come."






