

Dear Parish Family:

This past week Deacon Tom and I held a zoom meeting with over 20 parishioners who volunteered to help serve at our upcoming Parish Synod Sessions. We will be holding two Synod listening sessions:

Zoom Meeting on Tuesday, February 22 at 7:00 PM In Person Meeting in the hall on Tuesday, March 1 at 7:00 PM

As your Pastor, I'm inviting and encouraging you to participate in one of these sessions. Your voice is important and the intention and purpose of the listening session is to inspire us to dream about the Church we are called to be. Pope Francis is encouraging us to invite anyone who is practicing their Catholic faith, disenchanted Catholics and fallen away Catholics. Sometimes we only need to look in our own household. Please see this and last week's bulletin section on "Synod" to review some of the questions that will be presented at the sessions. Let's all gather together and let your voice be heard!

Next weekend is our Annual Together in Mission Announcement Sunday. Here is a summary of the mission of the campaign as I shared with you last week:

"This year's Together in Mission theme is "AS ONE WE BELIEVE". Together in Mission is the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal by all 288 parishes to support our neediest Catholic Schools and Parishes. Many of them have suffered great losses due to the Pandemic. Those parishes that are designated as recipients of Together in Mission funds also have a goal for their parishioners to pledge and support. This is the only appeal in the nation that goes to fund those most in need. This year's gifts will support 75 schools and 64 parishes in our local Church. Because we are one and we believe, we have the opportunity to provide parishes and schools with resources needed for the Sacraments, education, hope, and inspiration while building stronger families, faith communities and neighborhoods.

This year our parish goal is \$75,020! Please help us meet our goal by discerning and praying about your gift. The weekend of February 19-20 is Together in Mission Sunday and as in years past, we'll conduct the in-pew solicitation process. If you received the pledge card in the mail, please bring it to Mass in two weeks so we can fill out the pledge cards and make our gifts together. We'll have plenty of pledge cards available. (If you already mailed in your pledge card – thank you!) For the five years I've served as Pastor we've always exceeded our parish goal and thank you for your generosity.

This week, in a separate e-mail, I'll be sending out the 2022 Together in Mission Video which connects you with the children and families who will receive our Together in Mission gifts. I encourage you to spend the 7 minutes watching this inspiring video!"

BLESSINGS AND WOES

Today we hear once again of the deep connection between Jesus and Israel's prophets. In the reading from Jeremiah, God's curses at the opening are counterbalanced by God's blessings in the second part. In Luke's version of the Beatitudes, Jesus begins with blessings, then counterbalances with a "woe" section. The point is clear: the way we live our lives has a direct connection to whether we will experience curses and woes, or blessings instead. Of course, being among God's blessed ones (in Latin, beati, from which "beatitudes" comes) doesn't necessarily mean a life free of woe. Jesus, in his fully human nature, knew this. He also knew that when we seek happiness through our own devices, and trust only in ourselves, the woes are guaranteed to come. Let us follow the wisdom of Jeremiah and Jesus, along with the opening of the book of Psalms (echoed by Jeremiah today): "blessed are the ones who trust in the Lord."

I DON'T KNOW

There are times when the smartest, but most difficult, thing we can say is, "I don't know." While we often think of this as a sign of weakness, the amount of humility it takes to say this means that the word of God is alive and well in us. To say "I don't know" means that we look outside of ourselves to learn, and to find those who do know, and—ultimately—accept that we have to look to others and to God to help us, to guide us through life. To place our trust and hope only in this world, Paul tells the Corinthians (and us!), makes us people to be pitied. Jesus echoes this in the "woes" section of Luke's Beatitudes, when he points out that trusting in earthly wealth, full bellies, entertainments, and reputation will, eventually, not be enough when we are called beyond this life.

LOOK 'EM IN THE EYE

Prior to delivering the blessings and woes of his "Sermon on the Plain" in Luke, Jesus had been on top of a mountain in prayer, after which he selected the Twelve to go on his mission with him. Coming down from the mountain, the first thing Jesus does is show them what is at the heart of his—and their—mission: preaching to the multitude, healing all who were in need of it, no matter where they had come from. Luke then carefully notes that Jesus raises his eyes, not to look toward heaven again in prayer, but he raises his eyes to look directly at his disciples, to share the message of blessings and woes. This scene echoes Moses coming down from the mountain to give Israel

its command as to how they should live in God's covenant. As followers of Jesus to-day, we are called to live out his mission to the world, while we also look beyond this world to trust in God, our only hope.
