




St. Joseph's participation in the worldwide Synod is now completed. I would like to thank all who attended the listening sessions, including the volunteers who moderated the sessions and recorded the comments. Over the next few weeks, we will be publishing the report we submitted to the Archdiocese. This week, we are publishing the comments from the topics of Celebrating and Going on Mission.

Celebrating

- Mass deepens our relationship with God. No matter where we attend, the Mass is always the same, and is a very contemplative experience. Mass helps to cultivate a moral compass for the rest of the week.
- There were many comments that outdoor Mass and viewing Mass on the internet during COVID allowed
 people to continue to celebrate and deepen the practice of their faith in a way that was somewhat normal.
- Baptisms and First Communion should be celebrated at Sunday Mass.
- Good homilies are impactful and formational. The homilists explain the Gospels and scriptures in terms that we can relate to in our everyday lives. They bring the scriptures to life by sharing their own experiences.
- Many parishioners expressed great affection for our pastor and deacons, with specific reference to welcoming, inclusion and homilies.
- Participation as Eucharistic ministers, lectors, choir, altar servers/acolytes and greeters should be encouraged.
- Cursillo and similar missions invite people to community.
- There is a desire to create more community with smaller groups.
- Our young people commented that Mass is too long. They also suggested more time of silence for reflection. They would like homilies that are short and tightly focused, with very specific points and ties to popular culture. They said that if they were more connected to the Mass, they would better understand the message and be able to apply it to their lives, and • appreciate their friends and family more.
- Many Catholics do not fully understand their faith and the richness of the Mass, and would appreciate

opportunities to grow in understanding.


• A better presence on social media would help to reach Catholics and others more effectively.

Summarize any points of view that varied from the majority of comments

- Most people go to Mass out of obligation rather than joyful celebration.
- The church seems more involved in politics than it used to be.

Going on Mission

- Mission is realized in social justice/service/ humanitarian international aid provided by the parish. A large number of comments spoke positively about our parish's social justice ministry, as well as our support of Catholic Charities' ministries.
- We should collaborate with other faiths in reaching out to those who need help.
- The Church has opportunities for people who are open to joining. The Church is a prominent organization that offers support to charities and promotes social justice and is good at role modeling behaviors to support those in need. The Church is effective in being of service to others. The Church has active volunteers who offer their services and then benefit from helping as they continue to grow in their faith formation.
- We need to reach out to young people by going out to where they are, and encourage them to change and give them reasons to want to change, including reaching out to the "nones."
- The Church should encourage involvement in various parish ministries, such as bible study, occasional retreats or lecture series, religious education program, book club, and small Christian community discussion groups.
- Our young people commented that having mandatory service hours is a good thing in their schools and in Confirmation because it makes them give of their time, and they always feel good for helping someone out. Although sometimes they felt uncomfortable, that was when they had the opportunity to grow.
- We should pray for, encourage, and support a growth in vocations, not only for priests but for nuns, deacons, and lay ministers.



CONTINUING JESUS' MINISTRY

The celebration of the Ascension of our Lord occurs distinctively this year, when the two most detailed descriptions of the event, both written by Luke the evangelist, are brought together in today's readings. We hear both the concluding verses from Luke's Gospel, the first volume of his work, and the first verses of Acts, his second volume. For Luke, the Ascension is the hinge of his two-volume work. The evangelist apparently thought the story of the Ascension was important enough to tell twice. While his first telling emphasizes the meaning of Jesus' earthly ministry, the second telling shifts to how the community of his followers are commissioned to continue this same ministry. Now the apostles, and by implication all who follow Jesus, will bring healing and hope to a world that desperately needs them. Luke reminds us that we the Church are also summoned by Jesus to participate in his work.

ABSENCE AND PRESENCE

Appreciating the Ascension within the larger story of Jesus can be difficult. This is partly because of the mystical features of Luke's two descriptions, and also the lack of description in the other Gospels. The Ascension describes both the absence and the presence of Jesus. Why did Jesus have to leave? As Jesus told his disciples, his departure makes possible his continuing presence in a new way, through the work of the Spirit beginning at Pentecost.

The Ascension is more than a departure, for it describes how the bodily, human Jesus is now "at the right hand of God," and that the Father exalts Jesus as Lord of heaven and earth. We need to hold these two together: that Jesus knows our human trials and joys and walks compassionately with us; and Jesus also is our Lord, who pushes us out of our comfort zones toward Christian maturity, and holds us accountable.

WITNESSES

In the descriptions of the Ascension in today's readings, Jesus tells the disciples "You are witnesses" or "you will be my witnesses." The image of witness evokes a legal proceeding, where a person affirms the truth of an event. Sometimes physical evidence, such as a DNA test, serves as witness to the truth. This same word is used again and again in Acts, as the apostles witnessed to the Resurrection, or to the whole story of Jesus. We are called to witness the truth of the Gospel.

We might witness in at least three ways. In dialogue with others, we can speak the wit-

ness, by explicitly sharing the biblical story and what it means for us. We can do the witness, by aligning our actions and lifestyle so as to share love for others. We can be the witness, in our fundamental openness and faithful response to God, and in our gracefilled personal presence with others. We are the best evidence of the truths of our faith.






