Dear Parish Family:

It's a joy to be back with you this weekend. My Covid quarantine has ended and I appreciate all of the prayers for healing. I had a wonderful trip to Europe and the Pilgrimage to Oberammergau to witness the Passion Play was an amazing spiritual experience. You'll hear all about it in the homily this weekend!

Next weekend is our annual Mission Cooperative Appeal. This is our annual opportunity to experience our baptismal calling as missionaries and support the evangelization efforts in some corner of this beautiful world. Our guest speaker will be Fr. Aloysius Seiba representing the Archdiocese of Imphal in Northeast India. Thank you for welcoming Fr. Seiba to St. Joseph's and for your prayerful consideration and generous response to his appeal. As you have seen in the bulletin the past couple of weeks, here is the story of the Diocese of Imphal:

The mission diocese of Imphal in Northeast India is home to 34 tribes of Mongolian origin. The first Catholic baptism in the diocese was recorded in 1952. The Catholic population has grown up to 1, 01283 now. The diocese has 45 parishes, and 8 Mission Centers, 174 priests including 114 indigenous tribal priests. The growth of the Church has always been accompanied by various challenges and persecutions during the past decades. Between 1990 – 2001, six of our young and dynamic missionaries were killed for witnessing the gospel.

Besides direct evangelization, the Church is actively involved in the everyday life of the people through other forms of apostolate like education, health care, self-help program, rehabilitation of the sick, drug addicts and the orphans. Much remains to be done for this interior and underdeveloped region through your participation and generous support.

In spite of the many challenges, missionary efforts are yielding an increase in vocation to priesthood and religious life. The proceeds of the 2022 Mission appeal will be used for providing food, safe drinking water facilities, primary education of tribal girls and health care for the rural tribal population in the newly established parish of St. John in Nungba.






We hear the Psalms read or sung at every Mass between the first and second readings, but do we understand their significance?


