

Dear Parish Family:

Welcome to the 2nd Sunday of Lent! This second Sunday, we climb the mountain with Jesus as he is Transfigured. The Transfiguration of the Lord, and the personal experience that it was for the disciples, symbolizes where everything is going in God's good time. All of life is to be transfigured. All of our experiences in life are focused on God's destiny for us, the fulfillment of life in God!

Our Lenten season got off to a holy start with so many people coming out to receive the ashes on their foreheads, while hearing the words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel!" Our drive-throug service with the distribution of ashes was an overwhelming success as almost 350 cars passed through two reception lines. The average car had three participants so over 1,000 people received ashes. Our four Masses in the Church were almost all filled - so many of the faithful came out and Ash Wednesday is not obligatory – it's not a Holy Day of Obligation!

For the drive-through service, our high school youth welcomed cars into the parking lot, and they were directed by the Knights of Columbus who handled traffic control. The youth handed each car a QR code, and they were invited to pray the service with their family in the car as they wound their way through the parking lot to receive ashes. The drive-through was only 10 minutes long. The QR code included an audio podcast of the first reading of the prophet Joel from the scriptures for Ash Wednesday. Then they Let's pray for one another that we may be faithful watched a YouTube video of yours truly as I offered a two-minute reflection on their Lenten journey. They also had the opportunity to submit a prayer intention and over 71 shared what inspired their presence at the drive-through service. The QR code also included a link for almsgiving. I was the last stop as I thanked and blessed every Family for coming. A few people registered as Parishioners. As soon as we started

the service at 6:15 PM, the heavens opened and it poured rain. A great big hug of gratitude to our high school youth, the Knights of Columbus, and our ministers who distributed the ashes.

Tomorrow night, Monday March 17 is our Lenten Reflection Night. Join Sr. Eva and I in the church at 7:00 PM as we "Dig Deeper into Lent." An Irish festival with food and drink will follow in the courtyard. All are welcome! We are all Irish for a day! So, say I, Father O'Kostelnik!!

Tuesday, March 25th is our annual Lenten Penance Service and there will be eight priests available to hear your confessions! Only sinners are welcome!



Lenten Guidelines and Practices

Lenten Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year until the beginning of their 60th year. Fasting allows for one full meal and two smaller meals not to equal one full meal. Abstinence from meat is obligatory for all who have completed their 14th year of age.

fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat for all who have completed their 14th year. As always, anyone for whom fasting or abstinence would pose a health risk is excused. For example, pregnant women (breastfeeding mothers) or people receiving medical treatment are not

or people receiving medical treatment are not obligated to fast. Nevertheless, people especially in this category are invited to practice another form of fasting besides food.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

St. Thomas Aquinas said that friends share three things: time, possessions and secrets. For example, how do I know if you're my friend? Well, let's say we've been to Mexico together, you've tried my shaky attempts at pasta carbonara, and you know what ridiculous costume I wore in a music video I filmed in my early twenties. We, dear reader, are definitely friends. We've shared time, possessions and secrets.

How does friendship with Jesus develop? The same way. Jesus lives and eats with his disciples. Then he takes Peter, James and John to Mount Tabor and there reveals to them his deepest secret: his glorious, divine Sonship. The majesty of God shines from within his humanity in a way that goes beyond description. God the Father confirms this "secret," saying, "This is my chosen Son, listen to him" (Luke 9:35). It's all so precious that "they fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone." Do we take time to be alone with Christ, to allow him to mystically share this "secret" with us as his dear friends?

Lenten challenge: This week, identify one time when you experienced an awareness of some specific aspect of Jesus — perhaps on a retreat, at Mass, in prayer or in an act of service. Spend ten minutes consciously re-living that experience in your heart. If you can't recall one, set aside at least two hours this Lent as a mini retreat, either alone in nature or in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Focus on him and ask him to share the secrets of his heart with you. He will. Then, as his friend, share the secrets in your heart.
