

### Dear Parish Family:

Welcome to the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time. This weekend we will hear one of the more memorable stories that linger in our religious imagination. Jesus will recount for us the story of the Good Samaritan. All the readings this Sunday demonstrate that love of God goes hand-in-hand with care for one's neighbor. When we ask," Who is our neighbor", the response of Jesus is to learn to be sensitive to God's call to compassion and to show mercy wherever we hear it.

This weekend our parish celebrates a **Mission Cooperative Sunday**, and we welcome Fr. Ignacio Verdier to Saint Joseph. He is a Priest who serves as an affiliate representative working with the Dalmanutha Institution in Tijuana, Mexico

The Missionary Cooperative plan is a vital Pontifical Archdiocesan effort, providing crucial support to mission dioceses, religious communities, and organizations – often their sole source of funding. I encourage you to please be as generous as you can to support Dalmanuta. If you write a check please make the check to St. Joseph and after the Mission Appeal, we will send one check to the Mission plan. Fr. Ignacio has written the following:

"Dalmanuta Institution is a new congregation born in Uruguay – South America in 1980. We are both priests and religious sisters advocated full-time to spiritual direction. We nurse our spirituality and the spiritual exercises of Saint Ignatius Loyola. That's the reason of our name, Del Minuto from the book of Maccabees, which describes a silent and desert place where Jesus went along with his disciples, a symbolic way to describe our apostleship focused on inner and effective life. Since our foundation, we have spread out through Uruguay, Argentina, Brazil and Mexico. In Tijuana, we are two priests, one brother and two sisters working since 1994. We oversee a little chapel near downtown devoted to Saint Theresa of the Child Jesus. Currently our main needs are directed to the formation of new local vocations."





### **Gospel Meditation**

### **Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

I used to be a bad neighbor. I'd get wrapped up in my life and ignore those around me. Then I found sage advice from Benjamin Franklin to this effect: to be a better neighbor, ask someone to do a favor for you. It's counterintuitive, isn't it? Tell strangers that I need their help? Yuck. I'll risk looking needy. Worse, I'll be indebted to them. But I tried it, and it works like a charm. Recently I asked my neighbor Alan for a hacksaw, and Inga for an egg. They kindly obliged, and our friendship is growing.

This week we hear a scribe of the law cynically ask Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29). Like him, we prefer to keep the list of our "neighbors" as short as possible. It requires less interruption and inconvenience. But when Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan, he exposes the lonely, cold-heartedness tendency of the scribe's (and our) heart. My "neighbor" is anyone I encounter who manifests a concrete need. There isn't time to require any other credential because human need opens us to the happy reciprocity which is love.

Jesus' words challenge us this week to ask a neighbor for help in some small way. How marvelous that God himself shows us how. He moves into our world and asks us to love Him with small deeds of love. Maybe that's where Ben Franklin got the idea.

First Corinthians: The Church and the Christian Community explores the key elements of the gospel message that Paul introduced to a new and growing Church. Presenter Tim Gray examines Paul's advice for living an authentic Christian life in a pagan culture, as well as his teachings about the nature of grace, the Church as the body of Christ, and the most powerful gift of all—the Eucharist.






### What makes a child feel safe enough to disclose abuse?

There are several factors that contribute to whether a child is comfortable disclosing abuse to an adult. Children are more likely to talk about problems when they: have access to an adult they can trust; are able to understand that what is happening to them is not normal or safe; and trust that they will be believed. Another factor that may help a child disclose abuse is when a safe adult is intentional and asks direct questions about a child's life as it communicates caring and attention to the child's life circumstances.


