

Dear Parish Family:

Welcome to the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time. This weekend it's a great joy for us to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the founding of Saint Joseph's Parish. Our community of faith was founded way back in 1955 when Cardinal McIntyre declared this to be a canonical Parish within the Archdiocese of Los Angeles! The Second Vatican Council declared the church to be "The people of God" and so let's remember our ancestors and all of those who have formed Saint Joseph's into a community of faith!

This Wednesday, our school reopens with a record enrollment of 342 students. Please pray for all our students in our parish school, in Long Beach Unified and for our young people who are starting or returning to college! May they grow in wisdom, age, and grace!

Every two years, Archbishop Gomez calls all incardinated Priests of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles to the desert for a convocation. Starting this Monday, August 25, some 350 priests, including yours truly, will be going to La Quinta out in the Coachella Valley for the week. The purpose of our convocation is to gather as a presbyteral assembly to support one another, to pray for each other and our parishes, to strategize about future ministries and to celebrate our fraternity as Priests. This is not a vacation but a working convocation! The average temperature in the desert at the end of August is around 110°. The hotel rooms are very cheap – few tourists in Coachella at the end of August!! Being so far away also prevents Priests from running backand-forth to their parishes. The parishes of Long Beach have designated four parishes that have a religious order Priest who can celebrate a daily Mass. Our own Saint Joseph's was not designated to host a daily Mass. If you wish to attend daily Mass next week, you can attend one of the neighboring parishes. The schedule of Mass times at the designated parishes is just below this column.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I've been hiking Camelback Mountain in Phoenix, Arizona most of my life. It is a vigorous forty-five minutes to the top. Near the peak, the end suddenly appears much further away, and steeper. At that moment, a descending hiker often offers encouragement: "Keep going! The peak is right there. It's not as far as it looks. You can do it!" It usually works. After another five minute push, you summit and enjoy a glorious panorama of the Sonoran Desert in the Valley of the Sun.

When Jesus is asked about how many people are saved, he says: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate" (Luke 13:24). How many? Strive! Focus on your journey. What does heavenly census taking have to do with you or me? How would it help a hiker on a mountain to ask the others coming down, "How many people are going to make it to the top?" A normal response would be something like: "How is that a relevant question? Carry on!"

Jesus links one virtue directly to salvation: perseverance (cf. Matt 24:13; hypomone in Greek). Strive! Endure! Keep going! The one absolutely necessary virtue is perseverance, to not give up on our journey. The mountain we struggle to climb is often our own weakness, failures, and sins. Persevere in prayer. Keep celebrating the sacraments. Embrace daily duties. With God's grace, you are strong enough to keep going. Perhaps the peak is not as far away as you might fear. Keep going!

First Corinthians: The Church and the Christian Community explores the key elements of the gospel message that Paul introduced to a new and growing Church. Presenter Tim Gray examines Paul's advice for living an authentic Christian life in a pagan culture, as well as his teachings about the nature of grace, the Church as the body of Christ, and the most powerful gift of all—the Eucharist.


Food from the Heart: THANK YOU! We collected 12 shopping carts of family food and \$788! We purchased food as requested by Catholic Charities of Long Beach.


