

Dear Parish Family:

This weekend the Church celebrates the *Feast of the Dedication Lateran Basilica in Rome.* It's the Pope's Cathedral in Rome. It's considered to be the Mother Church of Catholicism. Why celebrate a place that most of us will never visit? Reflect on all the places of worship you have prayed in, all the sacred spaces where you have celebrated the Sacraments. All those spaces are connected to the Lateran Basilica in Rome, the eternal city of our Church!

One of the fruits of the "Welcome – Christ Renews His Parish" weekend retreat is that many of the groups continue to meet and pray and journey together long after the retreat weekend. Some meet weekly and some meet monthly. For some time, the men of Welcome Retreat team #4 have been discerning how they can give back to the Parish community. They have decided to host an evening of Eucharistic Adoration on the third Tuesday of every month. The Hour of Prayer will be led completely by them, and the clergy will not be present. My Tuesday nights are always filled with either baptism classes, Finance Council meetings, sessions with couples to plan their marriages, etc. The men of Welcome Retreat #4 asked to extend this invitation:

"Saint Joseph Parish will be offering Evening Adoration of the Holy Eucharist at 7 PM on the third Tuesday of the month. Our first adoration will be on Tuesday, November 18 from 7 PM to 8 PM. All are welcome to join us for a time of reflection and prayer in the presence of the Lord. This adoration will be hosted by the men of Welcome Retreat #4 and we hope to see you there."

During this November month of All Souls, we continue to remember your loved ones in the Masses and prayers at Saint Joseph's. Please remember that at death, we pray:

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was 22, I entered St. Peter's Basilica for the first time. It floored me. I could hardly take it in, its grandeur, majestic arches, vibrant colors, and the light that danced through its high windows. Somehow, amidst such splendor, I felt an overwhelming sense of belonging, as if I had finally come home.

Jesus reorients how we Catholics see sacred buildings. In today's Gospel he says, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:13-22). His riddle implies, shockingly, that his own body is now the fundamental dwelling place of God and humanity. The temple in Jerusalem has been superseded.

In our churches today — whether they mirror the basilica's grandeur or embrace humble simplicity — we experience architectural symbols of Christ's risen body. It is no accident we call them "churches": they make visible in brick-and-mortar Christ's body which is made up of the living stones we call Christians. Each church building, like St. John Lateran in Rome, or St. Peter's, or any other, is meant to be a vibrant sign of Christ's resurrected body. We should cherish and protect our churches as places where heaven touches earth, where we, as a community, are raised to the fullness of life in Christ.






